## **BIVISIBLE DRY FLY**



## <u>Recipe</u>

| Hook   | Size 10-22 dry fly hook              |
|--------|--------------------------------------|
| Thread | Black 8/0 Danville                   |
| Tail   | Black or grizzly hackle fibers       |
| Hackle | Dark brown or black saddle hackle    |
|        | for the rear half and dun or grizzly |
|        | for the front half                   |

- 1. Mount the hook in the vise and mash down the barb. Using touching thread wraps, wrap a thread base from 2mm behind the hook eye to the hook bend.
- 2. Tie-in 8 grizzly hackle fibers for the tail **(tail should equal the hook shank in length)** and secure with 3-4 thread wraps. Trim off the hackle butts. Let the thread hang at the hook bend.
- 3. Tie-in the brown/black hackle (with the shiny side towards you) by the butt end at the rear of the hook shank in front of the tail. Trim off excess hackle butts.
- 4. Wrap the thread to the center of the hook shank and let it hang. Now palmer the brown/black hackle tightly to this center point. Tie the hackle off with 3-4 thread wraps and trim off the excess hackle. Let the thread hang.
- 5. Now tie in the dun/grizzly hackle by the butt end (with the shiny side towards you) tight against the front of the brown/black hackle and secure it with 3-4 thread wraps. (NOTE: This hackle should be slightly larger diameter than the brown/black hackle.) Trim off the excess hackle butt. Wrap the thread forward to 2mm behind the hook eye and let it hang.
- 6. Palmer the dun/grizzly hackle forward tightly to just behind the hook eye. Secure the hackle with 3-4 thread wraps and trim off the excess hackle.
- 7. Finish with 3 half hitches or whipfinish. Cut the thread and apply head cement.

Note: Fish this dry fly dead-drift in the current, tie on a dropper if you like.
