## PEACOCK SOFT HACKLE



## **Recipe**

Hook.....Dry, size 12-14 Thread.....Olive 6/0 Weight....Lead wire .015 (Optional) Body.....Peacock Herl Collar....Brown Hungarian Partridge or Brown/Black Hen Saddle Head.....Thread

- 1. De-barb the hook and place it in your vise.
- 2. Tie-in the thread behind hook eye and wrap it down the hook shank to over the hook barb.
- 3. (If using lead wire, make 6-10 wraps in the middle of the hook shank and cover with thread to secure the lead.)
- 4. Select 4-5 peacock herls and tie them in on top of the hook shank over the hook barb. Form a rope with the thread and the peacock herls, and wrap it forward to within 2-3 hook eye widths of the hook eye forming a smooth body (or a slightly tapered one if using lead wire). Remove the excess herl and let the thread hang.
- 5. Select and prepare a partridge or hen hackle feather, tie it in by the tip, and make 2-3 wraps in front of the herl body soft hackle style, and then tie it off. Remove excess hackle.
- 6. Form a thread head, whip finish, and cut thread. (Be sure that the thread head slightly covers the butt end of the hackle collar, forcing the hackle to curve back over the body of the fly.)
- 7. Apply head cement if desired.
