## **MVFF FLY-TYING CLASSES WINTER WEATHER POLICY**

In the event of a winter storm the scheduled fly tying classes will be cancelled only if Montgomery County issues a Level One or higher snow emergency. If Montgomery County has not issued at least a Level One Snow Emergency, fly tying classed will be conducted as scheduled.

If you have a question about whether a class in which you are participating will take place or will be cancelled, please call (937) 496-7669 to find out if a snow level Advisory or Emergency has been issued for Montgomery County. When calling this number you will hear a recording about any current winter weather advisory or other emergency issued based on current current weather conditions. This recording is kept up-to-date 24/7 by the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department.

If conditions are such that we know far enough in advance that a class will be cancelled, we may be able to send out an e-mail, but the best way to check would be for you to call the number listed above.

Many MVFF members live in counties other than Montgomery County. If this applies to you, the weather conditions may be different where you live and you will need to use your own judgment about whether or not it is wise to travel. If due to severe weather (or other reasons) it becomes necessary for you to miss a fly tying class, we will be glad to schedule a make-up time with you so you will still have an opportunity to learn to tie the flies on the schedule for the class you miss, just let Woody Woodward or Dale Stephens know and one of them will coordinate a time with you for this purpose.

For your reference, the standard definitions of the three public advisory/emergency levels of winter weather are as follows:

**LEVEL ONE SNOW ADVISORY:** A level one-snow advisory means that roadways are snow covered and hazardous. Motorists are urged to drive very cautiously.

**LEVEL TWO SNOW ADVISORY:** A level two-snow advisory means that roadways are hazardous with blowing and drifting snow. Roads can be very icy. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be out on the roadways. People should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Obviously, if you are driving, use extreme caution.

**LEVEL THREE SNOW EMERGENCY:** A level three snow emergency means that ALL roadways are CLOSED to non-emergency personnel. No one should be driving during this condition unless it is absolutely necessary or a personal emergency exists. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Anyone traveling on the roads may subject themselves to arrest.
